

Briefing note

The new waste service starts in West Cornwall from Monday 1 July

24 June 2024

We start the new weekly food waste and fortnightly rubbish collection service next week for people living in West Cornwall.

You and your community will begin with this important new service, which we're putting in place to help people reduce waste and increase recycling for a more thriving and sustainable Cornwall.

We'll change the collections of approximately 49,000 households including Hayle, St Ives, St Just, Penzance, Marazion, Praa Sands, Porthleven, Helston, the Lizard and surrounding areas over a two-week period.

The date of each household's first collection on the new service will vary according to where they live in West Cornwall and when the collections are scheduled on the new routes.

People can find the date of their first collection and new collection day in the 'Go Collection leaflet' we posted to them in June or by going to www.cornwall.gov.uk/myarea and entering their address.

Support through the changes

We've continued to work hard over the last few months to make sure every household in West Cornwall has the right bins, collection calendar, instructions and support they need to switch to the new service.

We've written to every household directly to tell them their new collection day and to explain exactly what they need to do and when. Our recycling engagement officers continue to hold roadshows in libraries, village halls and community centres across West Cornwall offering face-to-face support.

Please note that there was a mistake on one of the 10 calendars that we sent out to the people who are collected on Monday week 2. This has been corrected and the 3,315 affected properties will get a new collection calendar with a letter of explanation in the post.

We know from the experiences of other local authorities and from our own experience of the changes in Areas 1 and 2, that there will be teething problems in the first few weeks and months. Our crews will be adjusting to new vehicles, collection rounds and schedules, and collecting food waste for the first time in your area.

We understand that some people will find it harder than others to adapt to a new collection day, separating their food waste and using the new caddies and rubbish containers. There will also be people using our recycling services for the very first time.

We have already had over 4,000 people sign up to have their old green bins collected. But we know that some local community groups and sports clubs are asking for them. If you know of any organisation offering to take them, please feel free to signpost you constituents to them.

We know this is going to be a very busy time for you, as well as for us in the Waste Service and for colleagues working in our Contact Centre. With that in mind, we've put together a list below of useful links and information.

• Check your collection calendar

The new service starts in rollout Area 3 from 1 July. Most people's collection day will change when their new service starts, so it's important to double check. This information is included in the Go! leaflet which we posted out in June people can also go the 'My Area' section of our website and enter their address to see their property information: https://cornwall.gov.uk/my-area/

Old bin collections and recycling

Residents won't be able to use their existing rubbish bins once the new service starts. We encourage everybody to consider reusing their old bin for another purpose, this could be used as a garden water butt, a compost bin, a place to store firewood, or for rinsing out wet suits etc. If customers can't reuse these or no longer want their old bin we can collect and - where possible - recycle it once the new service has started. Residents must sign up for this service by midnight on
